PAC News

Sacajawea's Parent Advisory Council (PAC) was created to bring parents, guardians, SMS staff, and community members together to enrich our students' middle school education. We work with the school to support and encourage parent/guardian involvement, which creates more success for our students.

Contribution Drive Launch

We've started our annual Contribution Drive and hope all families will participate. Every year the PAC gives from \$25,000 to \$30,000 to the school ~ for field trips, assemblies, scholarships, supplies, the science fair and special projects (such as a new school sign!). But the biggest slice goes directly to teachers, funding projects and materials they've identified as enhancing your child's classroom experience. Last year, for instance, we gave \$19,000 directly to teachers for such requests and other classroom needs.

That money comes almost entirely from our annual fundraiser, the Contribution Drive. This is where your participation is crucial! *We hope to raise \$20,000 this year*, a target we can hit if every family contributes \$35. But any amount helps and is welcome. Our goal is 100 percent participation, at any level. Contributions are tax-deductible and matching corporate donations gladly accepted. *Every dollar raised goes to the school.* Look for more information in the PAC packet sent home with your child.
