## Principal's Corner

As we enter May, the sudden realization of the impending conclusion of the school year becomes very real. As I shared with our sixth and seventh graders this past week, it is hard to believe that 5/6 of the year has passed. It's been a great year and we look forward to a strong finish.

These final few weeks bring a number of events leading to the conclusion of the year and the transition to next. During the final week of April, our *seventh grade students* completed the *Smarter Balanced* assessment. Although the test provider faced some difficulties, and we reduced the number of students tested, we believe the assessment will provide valuable recognition of the learning of individual students for their families as well as important data for our school. Look for those results in early summer.

All of our students will complete their third **STAR** benchmark assessments in reading and math in **May**. These short tests provide a snapshot of the growth of our students over the course of the year demonstrating individual progress, reinforcing our instructional work, and causing reflection for continuous improvement. Your kids will be bringing those **results home later in May**.

Our *eighth graders* will be traveling to *BHS* on *Thursday, May 28*, to learn more about their freshman year and have a chance to spend time in the high school. The next day, we will be *welcoming next year's sixth graders* to Sacajawea for a half-day. Those days are both valuable for the successful transition to the next level for these kids. We always love to welcome in the fifth graders and set the foundation for the coming year. Plus, they're so darn cute! The *eighth grade celebration* will take place on Thursday, June 4--always a bittersweet event.

### **Electronic Documentation for Next Year**

Sacajawea is in the process of *transitioning from paper to electronic forms* for gathering and distributing information for the coming year. Families of sixth and seventh graders will receive guidelines about updating enrollment forms, demographic information, health histories, and permission forms electronically. This change will allow families to *complete information on-line* and will make the schedule pick-up process in August much more efficient. BHS will implement a similar process.
