A Note from the Principal

We are quickly approaching the conclusion of Trimester 1 and what an interesting trimester it has been! Thank you for your recognition of these unusual times and the resulting changes we have implemented to provide the best possible support for your children's learning and safety. It has required a high level of flexibility from all of us, but we fully appreciate your support of your kids during this time.

On November 23 we anticipate returning to full-time classes with all of our students. We look forward to being able to work in-person with all of the in-school students each day. We will also continue to observe safe practices to the highest degree possible--having the students wash hands frequently, ensuring students and staff wear masks throughout the day, and maintaining a high level of cleaning and disinfecting of the facilities.

The beginning of Trimester 2 on the 23rd is also when students will begin their new elective classes other than year-long music or world language courses (eighth-grade). The standards-based report cards for Trimester 1 will be produced and available on-line during the week of December 7.

In the coming days, please have conversations with your students on their learning--what skills and concepts they are mastering--as well as checking on anything that may still need to be done prior to the end of the term. Demonstration of their learning through the completion of their assignments is necessary for us to provide an accurate report of their progress and growth.

We need your help!

Dear Bozeman School District Parents/Community,

We need your help! During this COVID situation we have approximately half of the available substitute teachers and paraprofessionals than we have in a normal year. We are working hard to keep our schools open during this pandemic but may reach a point where COVID cases affecting our staff increase to the point we cannot provide enough substitutes. If you can help us out on any day(s) you have available here are the qualifications and process.

You do not need to be a Montana Certified teacher to substitute in our District unless you are in a classroom for 35 consecutive days or more. We hire only certified substitutes for those long term situations. What we need right now are day to day substitutes rather than long term.

We are looking for caring adults committed to working with our students to further their education. The lesson plans and organization are created by our full time permanent teaching staff. In some cases, you will be asked to supervise a classroom while the teacher is instructing remotely. Other areas we need help include lunchroom, crosswalk and playground supervision. We need substitute teachers and paraprofessionals at all levels Pre-Kindergarten through high school.

If you are interested and able please fill out an online application as a Guest (Substitute) Teacher. Once you have completed the application please email sarah is our District Substitute Coordinator. She will process your application and contact you for an orientation. This process applies to both substitute teaching and paraprofessional positions.

We appreciate the consistent support of our Bozeman parents and community! If you are able to assist us in this challenging time, please fill out an application.

It has changed to a mostly digital program. Traditional clip out Box Tops are being phased out but you can still send them to school (make sure it doesn't say scan) to be turned in to the library.

The new process is so much easier!

- 1. Get the free new and improved **Box Tops mobile app** on your phone
- 2. Buy your groceries and ask for the receipt
- 3. Get into your car and take pictures of your receipt (within 14 days) with the app.
- 4. It will find any qualifying products and give 10 cents for each one to the school.

The money adds up and is used to enhance the book selection at our library.


