## Tetanus Booster Requirement

Students are required to have a tetanus booster (Td or TdaP ) within five years of the start of their $7^{\text {th }}$ grade year. For next year's $7^{\text {th }}$ graders, the tetanus booster must have been given after September 1 ${ }^{\text {st }}$, 2009. Proof of immunization must be provided in order to receive your schedule for the 2014-2015 school year.
