Two months into the school year has also provided time for you and students to experience the new standards-based learning format. As you are likely aware, we believe this format will reinforce student understanding of their current learning levels of the significant concepts and skills in each discipline. The students should have greater awareness of the next steps to mastery as well as opportunities to apply their understanding in unique, real-life, meaningful, and creative ways--the benchmarks of above proficiency levels.

The measurement of student progress is available through PowerSchool. Be sure to click on the "i" on your student's grade report to see the specific learning level for each standard being measured. Health Tips

- Be a role model.** Children who regularly see their parents enjoying sports and physical activity are more likely to do so themselves.
- Family meals prevent excessive weight gain:** Eating 3 or more family meals (meaning at least one parent is present and the meal is prepared at home) results in a 12% lower likelihood of children being [overweight](#).
- Family meals teach healthy food choices:** The eating habits of childhood often last a lifetime. Families that ate at least three meals together each had a 20% decrease in unhealthy food choices.
