Parent Liaison Corner: How to Put an End to Arguing

Arguing with your middle school student can be exhausting! Here are a few *Love and Logic* tips that will keep you from getting 'hooked' into an argument:

- 1. Go Brain Dead. Harness your inner power to disengage with your child when things are heating up. Say something like "This is important. Let's talk about this when we are both calm." Repeat this phrase as needed especially if the child is persistent. Another great follow-up question could be "Now, what did I say?"
- 2. Remain Calm. Imagine all of your child's angry words washing over you, not penetrating your protective armor. You are calm and in control. Your tone is low and slow (like a broken record). Your body language is neutral. Avert your eyes from your child if possible. Take a few deep breaths.
- 3. **Reconnect**. Circle back to the original issue when everyone has settled down. You may say something like "I'd love to talk with you about your weekend plans now that we are both calm." Are things still heated? Repeat steps as needed.
