With one month under our belts, we are pleased to share that we are off to a great start and the foundation is set for a terrific year ahead. New SMS Lockers!

Some students have been having a hard time getting their folders/binders into the new lockers. The new lockers do not easily accommodate a larger folder/binder system which seems to be fairly popular. Teachers do not feel that it is needed to have the large file/binder keeping systems. The interior dimensions of the lockers is 29.5 inches high, 10.75 inches deep, and 11.75 inches wide. There are also three hooks inside the locker for jackets. The mouth to the locker is slightly smaller, at about 28.5 inches high and 9.75 inched wide. Please have your students be mindful about what they will be putting in their lockers. They should discuss with their advisory teachers about ways to manage their locker space.
