Although we have had standards in each subject area for the past several years, the Common Core aligns many of those content-specific standards around the significant need for critical thinking, literacy skills and high-level mathematical practices. In the classroom, students will have increased opportunities to read purposefully, articulate and defend their thinking with evidence in writing, and apply their learning in meaningful, real-life situations.

I encourage you to talk with your student daily about what they are learning and how it can be applied in practical situations. We expect our students will be challenged throughout the year to become even better readers, writers and thinkers.

## ~ WeTip Hotline ~

The *WeTip Hotline*, sponsored by the Bozeman Police Department and the Bozeman Public Schools, may be used by anyone who has information about theft, vandalism, or other crimes that have been committed at one of our schools or in our community. The WeTip hotline is a way for people to get involved in establishing a safer community. While students are always encouraged to talk with an adult at the school, students are sometimes reluctant to report crime information because they fear reprisal from the person they are reporting. WeTip provides an alternative for students and families who wish to give information. WeTip hotlines are answered by tip operators 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Calls are taken on all crimes affecting schools and the surrounding communities. The operator taking the call will ask series of questions, designed by law enforcement, to obtain the maximum amount of information about the reported crime. After the information is taken, a code name and number are assigned to the informant. Information is then passed on to Bozeman's school resource officers.

Anyone who has information about illegal activity at a school can call WeTip 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at <u>1-800-78-CRIME</u>, or submit a tip on the internet at <a href="http://www.wetip.com/">http://www.wetip.com/</a>. For all emergencies and crimes that are in progress, immediately call 911.
