A Note from the Principal

The arrival of the holiday season also brings the end of Trimester 1 and the official recognition of onethird of the year having passed. It has been a most interesting year thus far.

First of all, thank you, again, for the support you have demonstrated for our work with your students. The pandemic has been challenging for everyone--students and teachers, for sure, but also families. We recognize that these unusual times have forced us all to be flexible, patient, creative, and resilient. Thank you for your willingness to learn along with your children--how best to support them, to utilize Canvas, to assist them with their schedules and organization, to maintain communication with their teachers. Your support is invaluable.

We continue to use the Blended Learning Model to maintain a safe environment at school while providing a strong educational program for the students. Although we only see the students in-person two days per week, the teachers are using Canvas to maintain their learning throughout the week. Wednesdays have proven valuable for on-going support and intervention. At this point, students should be fully familiar with Canvas and have the knowledge to navigate that platform to access their lessons, activities, and resources. The expectation of continued learning during remote days is essential for students to maintain their learning. Thank you again for reinforcing that at home.

Report cards will be available electronically on Monday, December 7. Please take time to pull the reports up on your PowerSchool accounts and have a conversation with your son/daughter(s). The standards-based reporting--3 for proficiency/mastery, 2 for developing, 1 for emerging--indicate the student's learning at this time for each standard. A 4 indicates application of skills in unique and independent ways. An "INS" indicates that insufficient evidence has been presented to the teacher for an accurate assessment of that standard (may also be indicated in the comment section). An INS may

be a result of significant absences, but could also be based on missing assignments--worth the conversation with your student.

Additionally, attribute scores are also provided in each content class--engagement, organization, perseverance, and universals (our school expectations). Please take time to discuss these scores with your child as these traits are valuable life-long skills and habits. The conversation can be a time of celebration or an opportunity for identifying ways to grow. It's all about growth!

You too can be a Book Whisperer- Notes from SMS Literacy Academy

With the break around the corner, reading books is a great way to relax and explore!

Parents often ask how they can figure out what their kids like to read?

Here are three easy ways we use in the SMS Literacy Academy to quickly find out.

- 1. Ask your child what was a favorite book read to them, movie they watched or tv show.
 - 1. This will give you information about the topic and genre which interests your child.
- 2. Ask your child what was the last book they read independently.
 - 1. This will give you an idea of what reading level your child is comfortable with reading by themselves.
- 3. Ask your child what they love to do in their free time.
 - 1. This will give you an idea of topics in the nonfiction realm or literature based in this topic area.

Keeping a steady reading diet is a great way to support your child's academic reading at school.

At SMS we use a method called Close Analytic Reading.

Close Reading

The sign of true learning is when a learner can demonstrate knowledge and feel like an expert on the topic. During a process called "close reading" a reader is able to investigate the text and draw meaning and conclusions based on information in the text. Ways you can help to support your students with Close Reading:

- Read different types of text
- Read a piece more than once
- Mark and discuss interesting or unfamiliar words
- Underline details Circle main ideas
- Spend time having a discussion about the reading
- Encourage your learner to ask questions while reading

Does Attendance Matter?

We all feel the pull from our kids: "Mom, its a powder day, can I head up to Bridger to snowboard? " or "I was up late playing video games. Would you call me in so I can get some sleep?"



It's just a missed day here and there. Does attendance *really* matter? According to Attendance Works, chronic absenteeism is the number one indicator that a student will drop out in high school. Missing only two days of school, per month, translates into missing 10% of the school year!

Whether its making it to an in-person class or showing up on remote days: attendance matters. Remember: attend today...achieve tomorrow!

Box Tops For Education

Did you know Sacajawea Middle School is part of the Box Tops for Education program? It has changed to a mostly digital program. Traditional clip out Box Tops are being phased out but you can still send them to school (make sure it doesn't say scan) to be turned in to the library.

The new process is so much easier!

- 1. Get the free new and improved Box Tops mobile app on your phone
- 2. Buy your groceries and ask for the receipt
- 3. Get into your car and take pictures of your receipt (within 14 days) with the app.
- 4. It will find any qualifying products and give 10 cents for each one to the school.

The money adds up and is used to enhance the book selection at our library. It's costs you nothing but 30 seconds of your time and you can help ALL the students at your child's school.
